The expression of a public

- The public expresses themselves through art, around the topic on which the painting is made.
- A social and citizen art and an heterotopia.

Highlight on a theme

 Light to 'enlighten' a theme, to create a dialogue around it and to guide participants through the creation of the artwork.

A public art experience

 We impact a community by inviting people to get together around one universal language: art.

A local collaboration

 Many artistic experiences have been created in collaboration with different partners, with the local audience on a specific theme chosen ahead of time.

A connection with art

 We create art projects to engage the public: a painting is created by projecting light through a glass artwork and having people create the painting.

A strong message

- Leading relevant conversations that align with core values of the group.
- Using art around a strong message brings awareness to a public and enables dialogue.

A stimulation for creativity

 Doing art is a huge stimulation of the brain: it stimulates ideas. It is a discovery of our own creativity, artistic skills and it gives the possibility to people to step up outside their boundaries.

A 'feel good' moment

 Art makes you feel good. Kulturelia light painting art projects could bring the public to a meditative place while having to concentrate on the canvas. Many participants say they feel great about painting.

Art by light projection is created from a dialogue with a group to create a connexion with art and within the public!

A collaborative artwork

- People are part of something big: a collaborative painting engaging many people in the creative process.
- Connecting humans as an expression of art creation: art is born in the heart

Artwork *in situ* that humanises the place

- A better perception of the place where the artwork is created.
- Humanisation of the place and an appropriation of a place.

The final painting is yours!

A group cohesion

 People participating to the project becomes a group itself around creativity. The collaborative painting brings a cohesion of a group with diverse profiles allows a better understanding of each other.

Human experience

• By enabling people to create a work of art and to be part of it, they connect with art, with themselves and to each other.

WHY?

ENABLE AN EXPRESSION OF AN AUDIENCE THROUGH DIALOGUE, SOCIAL CONNECTION AND A CONTEXTUAL, IN SITU AND CITIZEN ARTWORK

STEP 1 - DIALOGUE

We engage in dialogue, around one major theme. We keep the key-words to create the drawing on a transparent panel that we will project.



YOU ARE THE ARTIST

STEP 2 - DRAWING

From this dialogue, the artist creates the drawing on a transparent panel to prepare the projection.



Follow the light


STEP 3 -LIGHT PROJECTION

We project a light through the drawing.

STEP 4 - PAINTING

People follow the light lines to paint and express themselves.







Many symbols are found in these artistic murals, such as the bird that represents freedom and peace, the dragon of power.



Follow lights for fest mural

A wall on the public works storage shed in Port Coquitlam's Lions Park will get dashes of colour when the city hosts its annual Rivers and Trails Festival Sunday.

And visual artist Aurelia Bizouard wants the community to help her paint the 38' live light mural during the event that runs from noon to 4 p.m. in the Lions Way park.

Bizouard, who splits her time between Vancouver, Los Angeles and Paris, will start by painting nature scenes from around the city, on the back of a glass panel.

When done, she'll shine a bright light onto the glass, of which the lines will be projected onto the wall so participants can trace its lines and fill out the canvas with colour.

Bizouard told *The Tri-City*News her Light Lines Painting
project in PoCo will be similar
to the artwork she designed at
the Woodward's building in
Vancouver; last year, she also
set up a live light mural during
the popular Eastside Culture
Crawl, in east Vancouver.

"My main purpose is to connect people to art in a social setting," she said. "It has an impact not only for them but for the community. It delivers a strong message."

Bizouard said participants aren't afraid of a blank canvas when there's a general sketch lit up in front of them "because they can just follow the lines and then have the freedom to express themselves in the spaces in between. It's just magic what happens."

She added, "When they step out of their comfort zone and see the results, they have the confidence to be connected to something larger than themselves."

Bizouard said she hopes to get at least 50 people out to help her with the image (a tent will be set up if it rains); a follow-up workshop will be held the next day.

The finished work will be ready by late October.

Meanwhile, other activities happening during the Rivers and Trails Festival include: entertainment by acoustic folk singer-songwriter Jessica Barbour, aerial dance performances by Firebelly, world instrument workshops, a salmon smelt release and a guided walk by PoCo Heritage Trees.

The Sept. 23 festival coincides with BC Rivers Day. Visit portcoguitlam.ca/festivals.

Local artist creates giant public colouring book art project (PHOTOS)









When the public is invited to collaborate on an art project, the results can be pretty impactful-not to mention colourful. Local glass artist Aurelia Bizouard is the creative mind behind a "live light painting" which is like a giant public colouring book that's wrapping up

Located inside the atrium at Woodwards in Gastown, Bizouard has set up this collaborative painting on a wall by first creating an image on a panel of glass, through which light is aimed, projecting the pattern on a wall or canvas. Then, people are invited to fill in the lines, like a colouring book, with paint.

GRAND PARIS: les œuvres collectives de Kulturelia valorisent "l'art pour tous"

Le groupe Kulturelia, créé à l'initiative d'Aurélia Bizouard en 2017 à Vancouver, est implanté depuis 2021 à Paris. Il propose pendant quelques heures de réaliser une œuvre collective et sur un thème d'actualité, accessible à tous.

« J'ai toujours voulu connecter le public à l'art, trouver un moyen de l'engager dans le processus de création artistique et de s'exprimer autour d'une thématique actuelle. Cela permet de s'inscrire dans l'art et d'appartenir à un monde plus engagé humainement », explique Aurélia Bizouard, la fondatrice et directrice artistique de Kulturelia. Le groupe Kulurelia propose donc de créer collectivement des œuvres d'art, afin de permettre au public de s'exprimer sur un sujet actuel et choisi.

Devenir artiste le temps d'un projet

Accompagnée d'une équipe d'animateurs pour l'accompagnement technique sur la projection de lumière, Aurélia Bizouard a déjà monté de nombreux projets à l'international, en collaboration avec des municipalités, des équipes de développement local, des architectes, des associations ou encore des écoles. Centré sur "l'art pour tous", Kulturelia permet au public de s'exprimer sur un thème actuel à travers une pratique artistique collective, qui donne vie au terme de l'atelier à une grande réalisation sur toile ou directement sur une surface murale in situ. L'œuvre permet ainsi de créer du lien entre ses participants. qui participent à la politique du groupe de « faire œuvre ensemble pour faire monde ensemble ».

Kulturelia en Île-de-France

Depuis que le concept est arrivé en France, Aurélia Bizouard a développé des projets dans les 13ème et 14ème arrondissements, notamment au sein du Village Reille où une fresque a été créée à l'entrée du site. « L'œuvre est toujours créée dans un contexte donné et un lieu précis », souligne la fondatrice du groupe. Ces fresques permettent ainsi de parler de sujets importants "qui permettent d'éveiller les gens sur la question", d'après elle. A l'espace Chanorier de Croissy-sur-Seine dans les Yvelines, une œuvre a été réalisée autour de la nature, en lien avec Clé Verte, un programme de sensibilisation des jeunes à la nature, destiné aux publics jeunes. L'œuvre a été co-créée collectivement durant deux jours et les participants ont suivi les traits de lumière projetée pour réaliser le dessin. Désormais, la fresque permet également de servir d'appui pour sensibiliser le public à la nature.
